## Program Overview

The TigerView Campus Visitation Program aims to prepare participants to successfully apply to the graduate program of their choice, explore the opportunities for research and academic growth available at Mizzou, and engage participants in social activities, tours, and interaction with current faculty, administrators, staff, and graduate students connected to one's area of interest.

2020 TigerView participants will arrive on Sunday, October 4th, and have workshops and program visits on Monday and Tuesday, October 5th, and 6th. Return travel will be scheduled for October 7th.

Meanwhile, we will continue to monitor public health updates around COVID-19, including the review of federal guidance around domestic travel and adhering to University policies on hosting large gatherings. ## How to Apply

**Application Deadlines: Priority deadline is 11:59 PM (Central Time), July 24<sup>th</sup>. Deadline is 11:59 PM (Central Time), July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2020.** The program seeks applications from U.S. citizens or permanent residents attending or who have graduated from a U.S. college or university.

Members of racial or ethnic groups underrepresented in graduate education (i.e., Black/African Americans, American Indians, Alaska Native, Hispanic/Latinx, or Native Pacific Islander) are strongly encouraged to apply.

First-generation college students (including Ronald E. McNair Scholars) are strongly encouraged to apply.

Program space is limited; the focus is on applicants:

- with expected graduation date by May or Summer 2021;
- or who have earned their bachelor's or master's degrees;
- and who will contribute to diversity and inclusion at Mizzou.

To apply, please visit the TigerView [webpage](#) to [apply](#). Applicants must include the following in their online application:

1. Statement of Purpose, that consists of
  - why you are interested in the specific MU graduate program;
  - and your academic and personal background that prepared you for your chosen field.
2. A Diversity Statement, that consists of your philosophy of inclusive excellence. It may include experiences you have being a member of an underrepresented group in your discipline as well as ways you have applied an inclusive framework to past activities and engagements.
3. A Resumé or CV
4. An official or unofficial Academic Transcript(s)
5. At least one Letter of Recommendation that addresses why you are a good match for the graduate program in which you are interested.
  - Please note: the letter should not address why you are applying to the TigerView Campus Visitation Program.

Only complete applications will be reviewed. After the priority deadline, applications are sent to be reviewed by faculty from your program of interest. Applicants who are a good match with the program will be invited to visit campus. Applicants will be contacted by August 14<sup>th</sup>, 2020.
